

## PRIVACY POLICY IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 13 OF EU REGULATION No. 679/2016

### 1) Foreword

Atlantia S.p.A. (hereinafter "Atlantia" or the "Company"), with registered office in Piazza S. Silvestro 8, 00187 Rome, in its capacity as Data Controller, hereby provides you with information on the processing of your personal data in relation to the activities promoted by the Company under the "Atlantia4Ukraine" project.

This information is provided by Atlantia S.p.A. pursuant to Art. 13 *et seq.* of EU Regulation 679/2016 (hereinafter the "Regulation" or "GDPR") and in compliance with Legislative Decree 196/2003 as amended (hereinafter the "Privacy Code") and applicable legislation.

### 2) Categories of data processed

Atlantia shall process the following categories of personal data voluntarily provided by you:

- personal and contact data (e.g. name, surname, e-mail, etc.);
- information on participants in the open day and related initiatives.

In compliance with the principle of minimisation, Atlantia only collects data that is adequate, relevant and limited to what is necessary in relation to the purposes for which it is processed.

### 3) Purpose and legal basis of processing

Atlantia shall process personal data for the following purposes (i) managing your participation in the "Atlantia4Ukraine" open day and instrumental activities (e.g. organisational aspects, management of entertainment activities, etc.); (ii) sending you communications on initiatives and activities related to the "Atlantia4Ukraine" project.

The processing of your data is optional and will take place with your express consent (Art. 6(1)(a) of the GDPR). However, we remind you that in the absence of your consent we will not be able to inform you and send you communications about the initiatives of the project.

Atlantia shall not use your personal data for purposes incompatible with those mentioned above, unless required or authorised to do so by law.

### 4) Processing methods and security measures

Data may be processed by means of technological, IT and/or paper methods and through suitable IT tools (e.g. software, hardware, applications, etc.). In this regard, Atlantia has protocols, controls and procedures in place to ensure the confidentiality of its data, and is constantly committed to adopting, pursuant to Art. 32 of the GDPR, specific technological and organisational measures to protect data against the risk of loss, unlawful or incorrect use and unauthorised access.

### 5) Storage times

Your data shall be kept for the period of time necessary in relation to the purposes for which they were collected or subsequently processed, in compliance with legal obligations. In particular, they may be kept until the purposes related to the Atlantia4Ukraine project have been fulfilled or your consent has been withdrawn.

In the event of any litigation or for the exercise of the right of defence in a court of law, the aforementioned retention periods will be suspended until the complete settlement of the case between the parties.

### 6) Disclosure of personal data

Your personal data may be brought to the attention of persons authorised to process them by the Company, as well as communicated in accordance with legal, regulatory or contractual requirements, always in compliance with the principles expressed in Article 5 of the Regulation, to third parties such as:

- Suppliers for the management of project-related activities and services;
- Providers of services related to the management of communications;
- IT service providers;
- Judicial authorities and/or public bodies for whom communication is mandatory by law.

Third parties to whom personal data may be communicated may act as autonomous Data Controllers or Data Processors, undertaking in both cases to protect the confidentiality and security of personal data in accordance with the applicable legislation.

Under no circumstances will your personal data be disseminated.

## **7) Transfer of data abroad**

In the event that it is necessary to transfer your data to third parties located outside the European Economic Area (EEA) for specific purposes, such transfer will only take place where the European Commission has confirmed an appropriate level of data protection in the third country or where there are adequate data protection safeguards in place (e.g. EU standard contractual clauses for the transfer of data to third countries).

## **8) Rights of the data subject**

For legitimate and well-founded reasons and in accordance with any existing legal and contractual obligations of the Data Controller, you may exercise the rights recognised by Article 15 *et seq.* of the GDPR.

In particular, we would like to remind you that, in accordance with current legislation, you have the right to:

- request the updating, rectification, integration, cancellation, transformation into anonymous form, blocking of data processed unlawfully, including those no longer necessary for the purposes for which they were collected;
- have information about the logic, methods and purposes of the processing;
- receive the data in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format;
- revoke any consent you may have given to the processing of your data at any time and object, in whole or in part, to the use of your data;
- to lodge a complaint with the Authority, as well as to exercise the other rights recognised to you by the legislation in force.

Atlantia reserves the right to assess the applicability, with respect to the processing of your personal data, of one or more of the above rights.
